

City of Cambridge
Minutes of the Regular Monthly Meeting
November 17, 2020

The meeting was called to order at 6:04pm via Zoon due to the ongoing pandemic. In attendance were Mayor Sherry Tyler, Commissioners Brad King, Gayle Wilhelmi, and attorney Carrie Reisert. Commissioner Gary Osborne joined the meeting later. The minutes, budget report, and bank statement were distributed via email prior to the meeting. Brad made a motion to approve the minutes. Gayle seconded and the motion was passed.

New Business: Sherry reported there is one tax bill still unpaid from the Bayview Condos. The owner of unit #210 has an address that is not in Louisville so it may be that the unit is a rental, and they have not filled out a rental form. Sherry will send out a final notice of taxes due with a deadline of 30 days before a lien is placed on the property.

Sherry emailed Kenneth Reynolds who is our contact at Waste Management about the recycling truck that has been arriving at 6:30am or earlier. She asked that the schedule be revised so the truck would come later, and advised him of our noise ordinance that prohibits noise before 7am. He responded that he would take care of it immediately. She has also advised him in this past month that his garbage truck was observed again collecting both trash and yard waste that were not cross contaminated. Gayle has video to back this up should it be required.

Sherry has the new rental applications ready for 2021. She will mail to the appropriate addresses along with the business license ordinance.

A resident on Cambridge asked about the possibility of installing speed humps. Carrie says we would not be obligated to follow Metro Louisville requirements. We can minimize liability by painting stripes, and they cannot be installed near a stop sign. It was suggested we ask for feedback from residents by email when we mail out the business license ordinance. Carrie feels like the cost is around \$500-\$800 per unit. Brad will ask PSI for an estimate assuming we would be looking at two on Cambridge, and one each on Miles and Westfield.

Sherry says the Christmas banners will be put up around Thanksgiving.

Old Business: Mark Goetz cannot accept the spot as commissioner due to having to take another oath. His wife is interested, but she will not have lived in the city for a year until May. Unless someone else expresses interest we will contact her in May.

The second summary reading by title of Ordinance No. 4, series 2020-2021 was held. An ordinance imposing a license, tax or fee, upon certain home based businesses, occupations, trades and professions carried on and conducted within the limits of the City of Cambridge, Ky., requiring all persons, corporations, or firms pursuing same to first obtain a license therefore and regulating and imposing penalties for engaging in any such business, occupation, trade or profession without a license. Carrie will add a section that would prohibit any signage. Gayle made a motion to approve the ordinance. Brad seconded and the ordinance was passed unanimously by a vote of 3-0 with one absent. We will fulfill the publishing requirement by mailing a copy via first class mail to all residents.

Carrie said that the commissioners will have to be sworn in after the election has been certified. She is not allowed to do this virtually unless something changes. She will send a copy of the oath to everyone, and they will have to be sworn in by a notary in December or early January.

There will be no meeting in December unless some pressing business arises. With no further business to discuss the meeting was adjourned at 6:25pm. The next meeting will be January 19, 2021 at 6:00pm.
