

**City of Cambridge
Minutes of the Regular Monthly Meeting
Tuesday March 17, 2026**

The meeting was called to order at 6:01pm via Zoom. In attendance were Mayor Sherry Tyler, Commissioners Gayle Wilhelmi, Joe Penny, Gary Osborne, and attorney Carrie Ritsert. The minutes for January and February were distributed via email prior to the meeting. The budget report was not available yet. Gary made a motion to accept the minutes. Joe seconded and the motion was passed. Brad was in a serious car accident and is in the UL hospital. Sherry asked about sending flowers but they aren't allowed while the patient is in the ICU.

Old Business: The broken trailer is gone from the end of Miles.

The home that recently sold at 2909 Miles is for rent. The owners hope to rent to traveling nurses for \$2,300/monthly.

No updates on the carriage houses on McMahan. The facade corrections have not been done yet, and none of the available units have sold to date.

There remains one unpaid tax bill at 2903 Cambridge Rd. Sherry has asked that Carrie send the new owner a letter stating if the bill is not paid by April 1 the city will place a lien on the property.

The representative from Lumos reached out to Sherry about our decision granting a franchise agreement to install a fiber optic network in Cambridge. After some discussion it was decided to pass on granting the agreement and will let the matter drop.

Sherry plans to send out a letter to residents once the new tax rate and budget are set. Along with that she will include an overview of information including the Homestead Act. Also included will be an inquiry to residents on Miles as to how many would be in favor of installing speed humps on that street to address a concern from a current homeowner about vehicles speeding on Miles.

A couple rental fees remain unpaid, one being the property on Taylorsville Rd owned by S&T Properties. Carrie suggested googling the address and add "for rent" to find out how many units are being rented. Louisville limits rental units to 2 in a residence.

New Business: The street light on Cambridge has been replaced. There is a light pole leaning on Miles, and a call has been placed to LG&E to repair it.

The resident at 4202 Lowe Rd reported to Sherry about flagging in his yard regarding a new bus route to the hospital corridor. The signs along Browns Lane indicate 2' by 5' concrete pads will be installed as part of the new line to begin in August. The resident does not want a pad or a shelter to be constructed on his property. Sherry has sent an email to TARC requesting information along with a list of specific questions. Some information can be obtained at www.ridetarc.org or 585-1234. TARC said residents of the area affected had been notified of the new route, although Mr. Dillard says he was not informed.

Joe thanked the City of Cambridge for their contribution to Gilda's House in memory of his wife, Nancy.

With no further business to discuss the meeting was adjourned at 6:30pm. The next meeting will be April 21, 2026 at 6:00pm.
