

City of Cambridge
Minutes of the Regular Monthly Meeting
Tuesday September 16, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 6:02pm via Zoom. In attendance were Mayor Sherry Tyler, Commissioners Gayle Wilhelmi, Brad King, Gary Osborne, and resident Rob Hornung. The minutes from the August meeting and the financial report were distributed by email prior to the meeting. Brad made a motion to approve the minutes. Gary seconded and the motion was passed.

Old Business: Makk Landscaping left a message for Sherry stating that they will be in touch with the painters by the end of this week and should have a timeline for when the work will be done after that.

There is a public hearing scheduled for tomorrow about the Carriage House development across from Goodwill. Attorney Steve Porter, who we have retained to help with this issue, will attend along with Rob Hornung who lives next door to the development. The drainage from the townhomes seems to be the biggest issue apart from the glaring change in design. Rob said they have put in a 6' diameter retention pipe between his house and the development, but he wonders if MSD has approve their plan and if it will would work. He is concerned that water from the roofs of the garages and patio areas will drain towards his side yard and the retention pipe will be inadequate to handle that volume of water.

Rob also mentioned an organization called Trees Louisville that has a Neighborhoods Residential Tree program dedicated to increasing the tree canopy in Louisville. October 10-19 is "Tree Week" where they will deliver and plant trees that are not saplings, but more mature. This is the best time to plant trees according to the organization. Cindy Sullivan is associated with them. Rob suggested we contact them as we want to plant some trees on Cambridge.

All but eleven tax bills have been paid. Sherry sent out a second notice on September 12.

The sanitation increase was due to a provision in our contract that allows an adjustment once a year on July 1. Sherry will go ahead and pay the WM bill.

Kyle Roach from Otte Nursery has quoted us a price of \$400 per tree, but we must order by the end of October if we want to use them. They offered a list of six different types of trees to choose from.

New Business: The Cambridge street signs are looking worn and hard to read. Brad will contact Cadillac Signs to see about ordering replacements or perhaps change to something else.

The curb in front of Bayview Condos was damaged by a city snowplow last winter. Rob has called 311, but has not seen any action to repair the area. He suggested mor people put in a request on 311 to have it repaired. If they get more calls they might prioritize it.

Brad reported that the weeds at 2904 are getting unsightly especially with crabgrass growing over the new curb. The issue may warrant a letter or conversation about the state of the yard. Sherry will contact the homeowner about the issue.

With no further business to discuss the meeting was adjourned at 6:24pm. The next meeting will be October 21, 2025 at 6:00pm.
